A funny thing happened on the way to getting a new boiler at Faith on Jefferson...

Back in November, Faith on Jefferson faced the devastating news that a new boiler was required to supply heat to the sanctuary wing. We trembled at the prospect of what the financial implication would be for the church. Secondary to the cost was the inconvenience of not having heat.

Questions swirled! Hard winter weather was just around the corner. Would attendance suffer? Is this going to impact giving? Would our congregation be discouraged and disheartened with this event coming on the heels of our devastating roof leak that crumbled our sanctuary ceiling onto the seats below? Would our people give up and go elsewear?

But...as it turned out...**God Always Makes A Way** and none of those fears were founded! Thanks to the diligent work of our Trustees, we discovered an insurance policy was in place for our boiler **(thanks be to God!)**. A claim was filed and we held our breath to see what might happen; and yes, our Church Mutual insurance agreed to pay for replacement.

Next we were faced with how to continue worship with no central heat. Once again, God was with us as so many determined volunteers came together to create a comfortable place for us to worship. In just a few hours, the HeBrews Café was converted into a warm, fully-functioning chapel. We have everything we need, piano, sound, projection, seating, room for kids and babies, and of course, the popular coffee bar. But, the unfounded fear was still this among many...would anyone come?

God continues to be faithful to us and come they did, each person seeking out their seat comparable to where they would be in the big sanctuary. The best part of all was the joy with which the people came together. This up-close-and personal environment of the HeBrews Café produces a joy and camaraderie that is often not evident when we are all scattered here and there around the large sanctuary. There is a feeling that "we're all in this together." Yes, it's true, we're a little bit packed in at 11:00 service, but the joy of being together so closely, raising our voices in praise and prayer together creates palpable revival and rejuvenation to the worship experience.

Psalm 42:4 says, "These things I remember and pour out my soul within me. For I used to go along with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God. With the voice of joy and thanksgiving, a multitude keeping festival."

By the time you all read this, the heat will be on, and we'll all be back in our "own" spaces in the big sanctuary. We thank you all for your continued support, patience, and faith.

So, a funny thing DID happen on the way to getting a new boiler. We have rediscovered the joy of being close to one another, the renewal a change of environment can bring, and the feeling that we're all in this together. We are the church.

Deeply Rooted, Upward Reaching Campaign is Bearing Fruit!

The Deeply Rooted, Upward Reaching Campaign promoting the Western Pennsylvania Conference camps and retreats is bearing fruit from our Faith Community/Riverview Charge. Together, the churches in our Charge have raised \$2,103.50 this year. What's truly amazing is that almost all of this was raised simply by contributing loose change.

The Conference is promoting this campaign to raise no less than \$2.5 million but with an upward goal of \$5 million. The Conference Camping and Retreat Ministries service over 20,000 people each year through camps, program retreats and other ministry opportunities. These ministries are



divided between six unique locations: At the Lake Ministries, Camp Allegheny, Healthy Village Learning Institute, Jumonville, Wesley Woods, and the favorite of the women on our Charge, the lovely Olmsted Manor. All of these entities serve our faith development.



Christmas Blurbs




Our Secondhand Santa gave out more than 200 presents on the streets of New Brighton. The band SEEK First came out and played some wonderful Christmas music during the event.




Skit Sunday Every Last Sunday at Faith on 68

The beginning of Lent is marked by many with ashes, hence the name Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday **(Feb 26 this year)** is the first day of Lent, and Ash Wednesday is always 46 days before Easter Sunday, which is Sunday, April 12 this year. The observance of Lent spans 40 days, ending on the Saturday before Easter

The last week of Lent is called Holy Week and includes Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday (technically not a fasting day), Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Friday, and Holy Saturday or Black Saturday.

Unlike Advent, which is a time of celebration and excitement looking forward to an arrival, **Lent is observed in a more solemn way preparing for and reflecting on Jesus' sacrificial death.** But at the **end of Lent is Easter Sunday, and that is the most joyous celebration because our Savior Jesus Christ was resurrected and lives on.** Because of his death and resurrection, we are offered new life to live as covenant children in the kingdom of God forever.



Ash Wed is Feb 26 and begins Lent Palm Sunday, April 5- Begins Holy Week

Maundy Thursday – April 9-commemorates the foot washing Good Friday April 10, commemorates crucifixion-

Easter Sunday, April 12, Celebrates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead and his victory over sin and death.


